#### Adoption of the Agenda

Council Member Curtis Capps made a motion to approve the agenda. Council Member Mike Ernst seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a vote of five (5) in favor and none opposed.

#### Approval of the October 12, 2021 Town Council Meeting Minutes

Council Member Heather Coleman made a motion to approve the October 12, 2021 meeting minutes. Council Member Chris Fowler seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a vote of five (5) in favor and none opposed.

Public Comments - Paul Dixon of 120 Kilbourne Drive in Kinderton Village publicly thanked Mayor Cross and Lee Rollins, Town Manager for their quick action following an incident at Rise at the end of October where residents were kept awake due to noise lasting until early morning.

#### **Presentation: Davie County Public Utilities**

Johnny Lambert, Utilities Director, presented as he has done for Davie County Commissioners.

## Budget Amendment - General Fund Acceptance from Bermuda Run Community Vision Fund

The Town Manager recommends the 2021-2022 General Fund Budget be amended to accept \$7,000 from the Davie County Community Foundation as revenue and expend \$7,000 for expenses related to the "Christmas in the Town of Bermuda Run" event to be held on December 5, 2021.

Council Member Heather Coleman made a motion to amend the budget. Council Member Curtis Capps seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a vote of five (5) in favor and none opposed.

#### Town Manager/Council/Mayor Comments

Lee Rollins – Ivy Circle tree planting confirmed for first 3 weeks of December. Data has been collected for the Phase II Stormwater Study – presentation planned for December or January. Blue Heron Trail bids received – well over the estimated cost. Options will be presented to Council in the next 30 days. Leaf pickup has begun.

Ken Peacock – Very informative meeting; thanked Johnny Lambert for his presentation. Curtis Capps – Thanked Johnny Lambert and everyone for their attendance. Stressed that the Council/Staff emails and contact information is on the Town's website.

Mike Ernst – Thanked everyone, stressing that communication is very important. Noted Johnny Lambert's statement that "there is no longer a sewer capacity issue in BR", as this has not always been the case.

Chris Fowler – Agreed with the other comments, and thanked Paul Dixon for speaking. Heather Coleman – Communication is key; asked that we consider residents who don't have email and send more "paper" news. Shared issue at the BR East Package Room of residents not getting packages from lockers in a timely manner. Idea – put up signs in package room.

#### RESOLUTION SUPPORTING A REQUEST TO THE WINSTON SALEM MPO FOR ADDITIONAL FEDERAL FUNDS FOR TIP PROJECT EB-5958 BLUE HERON TRAIL

**WHEREAS,** The Town of Bermuda Run lies along the northeast boarder of Davie County and adjacent to neighboring Village of Clemmons in Forsyth County; and

WHEREAS, An August, 2011 Yadkin River Greenway Feasibility Study funded by the Winston-Salem Area MPO for the Town of Bermuda Run, the Village of Clemmons and the Town of Lewisville, recommended a system of greenway trails and sidewalks to include US 158 Bike/Pedestrian Trail and Sidewalk and Bahnson Lake Trail; and

WHEREAS, Interstate 40 intersects the Bermuda Run corporate limits, with the Exit 180, NC 801 bridge being the only current connection between the north side of the Town and the south side of the Town; and

WHEREAS, The 2012 Town of Bermuda Run Comprehensive Plan and its 2017 update Strategy T5 states, "Work with NCDOT to utilize the tunnel under I-40 and replace Bert's Way bridge for pedestrian and bicycle use after the proposed widening of I-40; and

WHEREAS, The I-40 widening project and installation of a new pedestrian bridge is in place; and

**WHEREAS,** The Town has created a first phase Blue Heron Trail which is intended to connect north and south Bermuda Run residents via a multi-use path; and

WHEREAS, The Winston-Salem MPO approved in 2018 the allocation of federal highway funds for this project TIP # EB-5958 in the amount of \$1,671,200 with a local commitment match of \$417,800 for a total estimated cost of \$2,089,000; and

**WHEREAS,** An NCDOT review of updated total project estimate on March 30, 2021 was in the amount of \$2,099,414; and

WHEREAS, The Town of Bermuda Run was given the notice to proceed to bid the project with bid opening on November 9, 2021 and of four bids received, the lowest responsive responsible bid was \$2,801,732; and

WHEREAS, The total project cost, to include proposed CEI and NCDOT project oversight now totals \$3,692,994.33, with the Town requesting additional federal funds to total \$2,954,395.46 and the Town match now totaling \$738,598.87.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT,** the Bermuda Run Town Council supports the request for additional federal funding allocated by the Winston-Salem Area MPO in the amount of \$1,283,195.46 to be included with the approved amount of \$1,671,200 for total federal funds of \$2,954,395.46, and is committed to a revised local match total of \$738,598.87.
