Leaf Pickup for residents runs continuously through the first part of January. There is no set schedule. **Please do not put leaves in the street.

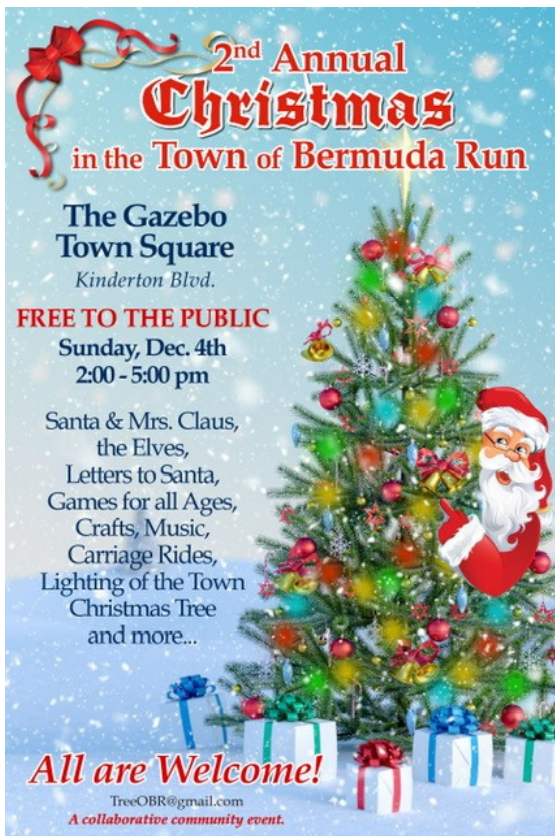
Leaves are picked up by a different contractor than brush/limbs, so please keep separate!

Bermuda Run Town Hall, Jerusalem Fire Dept,
and Davie Board of Elections ongoing through
Saturday, 11/5**

Monday, 10/31 - Friday, 11/4 ~ 8 am - 7:30 pm

Saturday, 11/5 ~ 8 am - 3 pm

The 2022 general election is on **Tuesday, November 8, 2022**. On this day, registered voters in North Carolina may vote at their assigned polling place. This is different than [early voting](#), where eligible individuals may cast a ballot at any early voting site in their county.

Not sure of your polling place location? Click: [POLLING PLACE SEARCH](#).

Polling places will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.: Any voter in line at their assigned polling place at 7:30 p.m. will be able to vote. The busiest times tend to be early in the morning and just before the polls close. Avoid longer lines by voting at off-peak times.

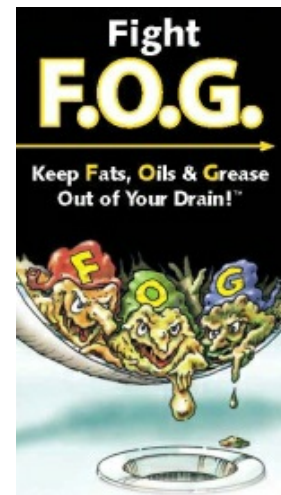

Fats, Oils and Grease are also known as F.O.G. which comes from food such as cooking oil, lard, shortening, meat fats, sauces, gravy, mayonnaise, butter, ice cream and soups. Sink, dishwasher, hood and floor cleaning wastewaters and food scraps may also be sources of F.O.G.

Help prevent F.O.G.

Specific actions can be taken in the kitchen: Never pour fats, oils, or grease down a garbage disposal, sink, or storm drain. Instead, allow F.O.G. to cool and then seal it in a can or bottle and dispose in household trash. Remove remaining F.O.G. from pans and dishes by scraping and absorbing with a paper towel. Hot water and soap do not eliminate F.O.G. because it will eventually reform and solidify in pipes.
