Town Manager Project Updates

Work steadily continues on the 10 ft wide, 5,400 ft long multi-use path ***The Blue Heron Trail***. The trail is over 60% complete and considerable work has been accomplished. The prefabricated steel bridge has been set in place and much of the trail has been paved. Trail lighting will be the next milestone of the project as electrical and telecommunication lines are being completed. The project is anticipated to be completed in the Summer of 2023.

The significant overhaul and modification to the operation of the Bermuda Run Sewer Treatment Plant continues. The temporary bypass sewer pumping station is operational and is now sending wastewater to the Eastern Davie Sewer facilities. The demolition of the plant structure and foundation has occurred and removed from the site. The project is anticipated to be completed in Fall of 2023.

Street Light Issues

As the evenings get darker earlier due to the end of daylight saving, it is important to keep our streets well-lit so everyone can get to their destinations safely. If you notice a street light that is off or flickering you can report it to Duke Power <https://salor-web.duke-energy.app/#/home/map> or contact Town Hall at 336-998-0906 with address closest to the light, and the light pole number (if available).

Who do I call if I have a water emergency after hours?

The Davie County Public Utilities office is open Monday - Friday 8 am to 5 pm. If there is an emergency outside of those hours, you can call communications at 336-751-0896 who will notify the on-call line maintenance personnel of your emergency.
